

An important note on the program:

1) The NNS is an organization for everyone working with neuromodulation; SCS, DBS, PNS, SNS etc.

However, since this is the first meeting of the organization we have decided to keep focus on SCS (and DRG) for pain since this is the field that occupies the majority of our members.

For later meetings we certainly aim to expand the scientific and clinical program into other treatment modalities and indications.

2) DISCUSSION SESSIONS

During Saturday we will have two discussion sessions of 30 minutes each.

One will be titled “New indications for SCS”, the other “The future of the Nordic Neuromodulation Society”. The sessions will feature a short introduction but no lengthy presentations; they will be a forum for plenary discussion.

3) POSTERS

We encourage all participants to bring a poster for the meeting. It can be a poster created specifically for the NNS meeting but it may certainly also be a poster used at another (fairly recent) meeting. Any topic related to neuromodulation is welcome. This will give participants a chance to discuss their results with Scandinavian colleagues and gather further attention to their work.

We also strongly encourage members who have not presented their work in an international forum before to make a poster for the meeting.
